### **Ground Ownership and Shares**

I am writing to you for two main reasons. Firstly, documents obtained by Dulwich Hamlet Supporters' Trust (DHST) appear to show that freehold of the Champion Hill ground and other land is now held by a company called DHPD Ltd whose Director is Eren Muduroglu.

If it is the case that the freehold has been secured for the football club's long term use, then this is an extremely welcome development for supporters. However, until there is a public statement on the matter, the supporters will have certain concerns to know what future holds, for example:

- What was the reason behind creating an entirely new company to acquire the freehold?
- Is the current lease for DHFC still in place or has a new one been negotiated?
- If not yet in place, when does DHFC plan to enter discussions to regarding a new lease and what terms will it be seeking?
- Are there any plans for ground improvements?
- Are there any plans for any developments on the other land?
- Above all, are the owners of DHPD Ltd and DHFC Ltd able to commit to the continued use of the Champion Hill stadium as the club's home in the long term?

Given the importance of this issue to the club's supporters, can I suggest that an early public statement from the club would be timely. Even better would be an open meeting for fans at which officials of DHFC and representatives of DHPD explain what the plans are with regards to the ground, the share ownership (see below) and any developments

related to your stated intention to find other parties to run the club as announced in March. Such a meeting would be an ideal forum in which to kill off rumours and speculation and allow you to set the record straight and demonstrate the way in which you have finally secured the club's future at Champion Hill, which would be good news all round. The Trust would be very happy to help arrange and publicise the meeting and would be equally willing to answer questions from supporters at such a meeting.

The second reason to write is to ask you to clarify the position with regard to shares in Dulwich Hamlet Football Club Ltd (DHFC).

Documents lodged at Companies House appear to show that all 300,000 shares of DHFC are in your name, with no reference to the small number shares belonging to a number of other individuals and DHST. Given that you referred to the small shareholders in your press comment in March, I would be grateful if you could confirm in writing for the benefit of all those shareholders that this is an administrative error that will be corrected and not anything more serious.

Finally, although you have not responded to previous letters and attempts to contact you by telephone have been unsuccessful, let me re-iterate the fact that the Trust remains very willing to meet without pre-conditions to discuss ways in which we can positively work together with the club to secure its future.

Please note that DHST will be issuing a press release on the matters above, in which we will mention that we have written this letter. As a membership-based organisation we will also publish this letter on our web-site in due course.

I look forward to hearing your response to the above issues
